**388.512, Sec. 3 (1d)** "Eligible course" means a course offered by an eligible postsecondary institution that is not offered by the school district in which the eligible student is enrolled, or that is by the school district but is determined by the board of the school district to not be available to the eligible student because of a scheduling conflict beyond the eligible student's control; that is an academic course not ordinarily taken as an activity course; that is a course that the postsecondary institution normally applies towards satisfaction of degree requirements; that is not a hobby craft or recreational course; and that is in a subject area other that physical education, theology, divinity, or religious education."

5.) Calculation of Tuition to be paid by Warren Consolidated Schools					
<b>LINE A:</b> Enter the state portion of the student's foundation allowance for the 2010-11 school year. (Source: State of Michigan 2009-10 State Aid Financial Status Report, dated 08/20/10; 20j funding subtracted from Total Foundation Allocation.)	\$ 6,593.66				
<b>LINE B:</b> Divide the amount on <b>Line A</b> by two (2) to determine the revenue per student, per semester. Enter this amount on <b>Line B</b> .	\$ 3,296.83				
<b>Line C:</b> To determine the proportion of time a student attends the college per semester, create a fraction. The numerator is the total number of courses the student is enrolled in at the college. The denominator is the total number of both Warren Consolidated Schools and college courses enrolled in by the student. Enter this fraction on <b>LINE C.</b> Example: 2 courses enrolled at college and four courses enrolled in at WCS high school equals 6 total enrolled courses or 1/3.					
LINE D: Multiply the fraction on LINE C by the revenue per student, per semester (LINE B) to determine the amount that will be available for college courses. Enter this amount on LINE D.					
LINE E: Subtract the amount available for college courses (LINE D) from LINE B (the foundation allowance per student, per semester). The remainder will remain in the district. Enter this amount on Line E.

<u>Please note:</u> If a student signs up for a class that was not approved by his/her high school and the seven (7) days have passed for withdrawal that student is responsible for the tuition and course fees for that class.
